

Northern Border Regional Commission Overview

- Total of 201 Awards
- Requests in 2018: \$26,176,965 Grants Made: \$11,546,840
- 89 Applications received 46 Grants Made
- Leveraged Match Ratio 1:4.5

PURPOSE: To address the economic shift produced by the chronic and consistent decline of the forest products industry that has led to displacement of a skilled workforce and significant negative demographic changes in the rural areas of the Northern Border Regional Commission region.

GOAL: Fund projects that, when completed, increase the ability of the four-state region to attract new opportunities, that are highly leveraged, transformational investments that have a fundamental impact on community economic revitalization.





All the same regulations and congressional mandates apply

- Distress Criteria used to determine minimum required match
- 50 % of Appropriations used in Distressed counties
- 40% of Appropriations spent on Infrastructure
- Eligible Applicants
 - Local Governments, Political subdivisions, non-profits, Indian Tribes
- 80% cap on federal dollars in any project












Threshold Criteria







- Evaluation Advisory Team
- Invitation to submit full application
- 2 years to complete projects
- 6 months to complete funding
- Projects that are regional in scope




Applications Due May 10, 2019

- March 29, Letters of Notification (appreciated)
- May 10, Applications Due
- July 26 August 2, Grant Award Announcements
- August 30, Signed Grant Agreements to NBRC
- September 2- October 18, Mandatory Grant Recipient Webinar
- September 30, 2020, Must receive Notice to Proceed



Total Funds Available for 2019 \$14,072,853

Approximately Allocated evenly across the four states





Who is eligible?

Who is NOT eligible?

- State and Local Governments including villages, towns, cities, and counties
- Othe political subdivisions e.g. Regional Planning Commissions
- · Native Indian Tribes
- · Non-profit entities with a 501 (c) status
- Past recipients are eligible if they have completed 75% of their past projects.

- · For Profit Entities
- · LLC's or other entities that are not a 501 (c)
- Any 'eligible' entity that is ineligible due to past history with administering federal funds

Are Past Recipients Eligible?

- The entity has submitted reimbursement requrests totalling at least 75% of the current project
- and, the entity has demonstrated that at least 75% of committed match has been completed by July 12, 2019

Federal Ceiling

Yes, NBRC funding can be used to match other Federal Funding programs HOWEVER, it can only be used to match up to 80% of the total project costs.



What are eligible uses?

- *Transportation Infrastructure
- *Telecommunication Infrastructure
- *Basic Public Infrastructure
 Business and Workforce Development
 Basic Health Care
 Resource Conservation, Tourism and Recreation
 Renewable and Alternative Energy
 Studies and planning such as engineering

(* Indicates infrastructure projects)

Eligible Costs

Bricks and Mortar
Training and Education
And those things that are necessary to implementation of a project

What are NOT eligible uses?

- pass-thru funds
- projects that relocate businesses from one area of the region to another
- supplant existing Federal Programs
- projects that promote unfair competition between businesses with the same service area

Ineligible Costs

- Food and beverages for meetings
- Alcohol
- Entertainment
- Appraisal costs
- Allowance or payment of debt
