



Project Maps and Location Guidance

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Project Maps

The applicant should upload a map that meets the following criteria:

- Maps should show the “Investment Locations” where NBRC funded work will occur. Note that this is not necessarily the same location as where the grantee is located e.g.: services provided, training site, or built structure. This is separate and apart from total economic benefit which would include indirect benefits.
- Locations identified on the project map should align with the chosen investment locations from the application “Locations” tab
- Investment locations should be clearly marked and labeled with details such as addresses and coordinates, and may include major landmarks (such as major highways) for the viewer’s reference.

Pro-Tip: Verify Investment Locations

- NBRC uses the US Census Bureau’s, Geocoder in the GMS. Grantees should make every effort to provide “Validated” locations in both the Investment Locations and Project Map.

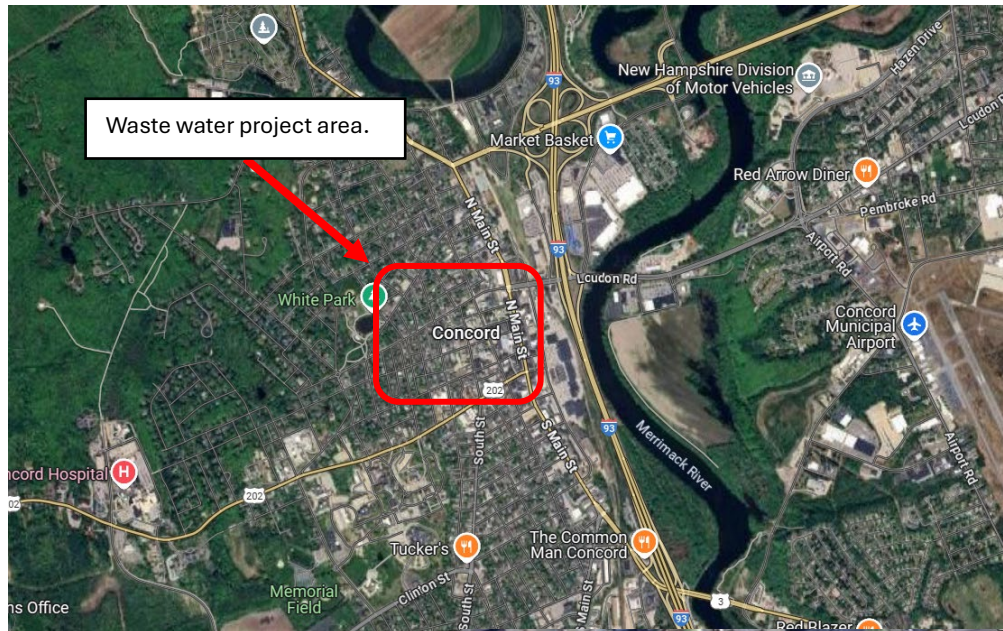
- Navigate to the Find Geographies Tab, One Line Address Processing. **See Investment Location example on page 4.** Use the Benchmark and Vintage indicated in the example to practice.
- ***A validated address will get results. An invalid address will have “no matches.”***
- Addresses may need a minor modification, click “Get Results” again to make another attempt.
- Some projects will not have a valid street address, or it will not be possible due to the nature of the project. In those cases, grantees may input the latitude and longitude.
- If there are further issues, please contact admin@nbrc.gov if the tool is not working as intended.

Project Map FAQs

- ***What if my project is for planning or a feasibility study?*** A: Map should depict where the implementation of the infrastructure feasibility study or plan will be. For example, if the project is a feasibility study for a new wastewater treatment facility, the map should show the location of the planned facility. If the project is a plan for a community, the map should show the community location.
- ***What if my project occurs in more than one location?*** A: Projects with multiple locations should upload maps (multiple, if needed) that clearly show the various investment locations.
- ***I’m not certain the exact location where my project will take place. What should my map show?*** A: If unsure where the investment will take place, the applicant should identify “Proxy” locations. For example, a workforce development project with unidentified training sites might use proxy locations such as a town or city hall, town center, or other official public building to demonstrate in relative terms where the investment will occur. Example Project 1 New Wastewater Infrastructure will be installed in Concord, NH.



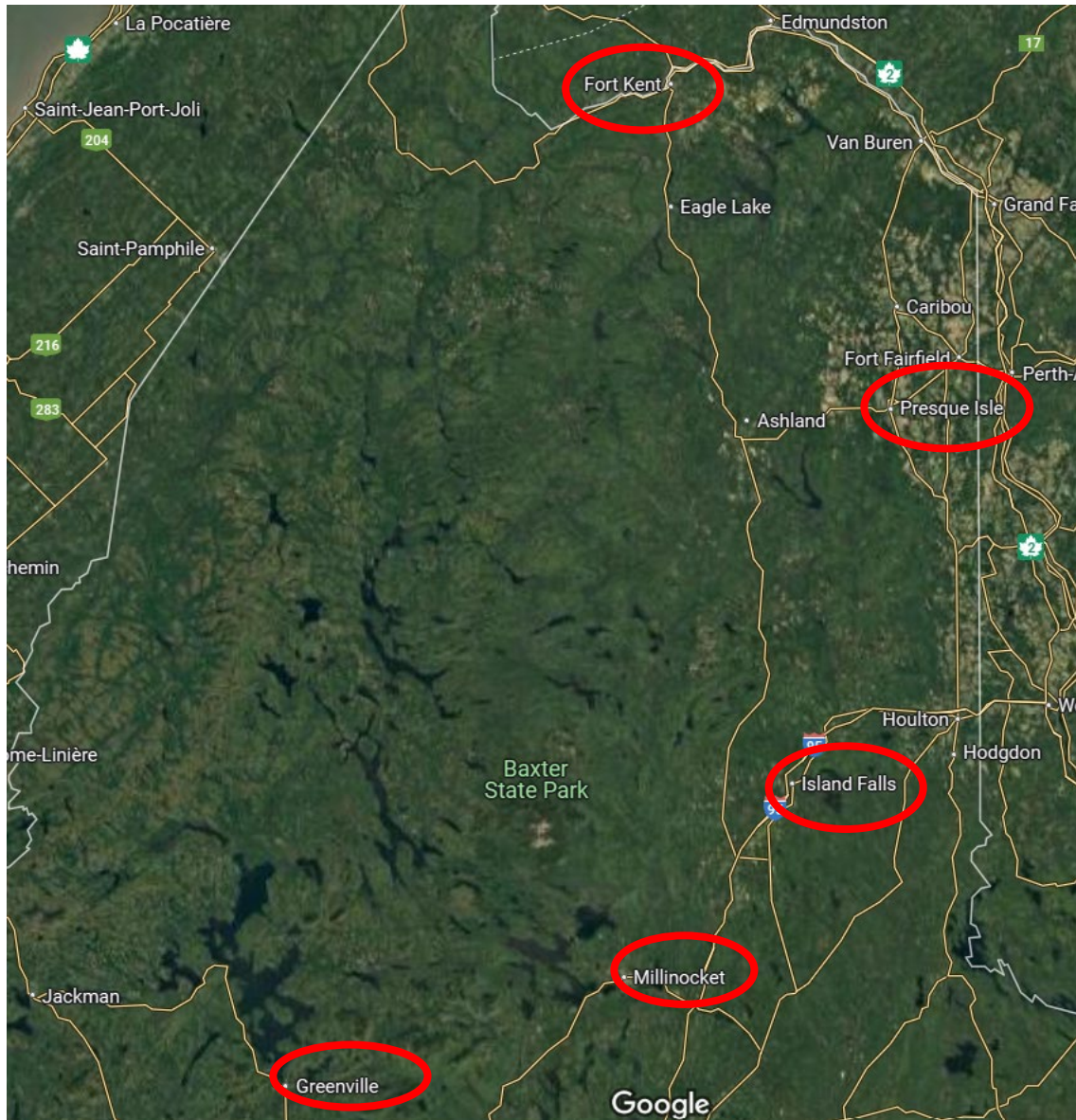
Note: There isn't one specific address for each location. Instead, we used mid points of each line and listed the latitude longitude points we found using Google Maps.

Example Project 2 Local Forestry Equipment Manufacturing Program.



We picked proxy locations via town offices since our initial estimates will include 5 towns, but we don't have exact addresses yet. Most projects will be in Aroostook County, Maine with one site in Piscataquis County, Maine. All checked with the [Census Geocoder](#) and have addresses that worked.
