

# Aroostook County

Fall Award to: Loring Development Authority

**Project:** NBRC funds will be used for the construction of an anaerobic digester. This initiative aims to enhance the Loring Commerce Centre's appeal to a prospective \$60,000,000 potato chip production plant, earmarked for the site of the former Loring Air Force Base in Limestone, Maine.

Fall Award to: City of Presque Isle

Project: NBRC funding will be used to upgrade the commercial kitchen at The Forum, a city-

owned building which is an important year-round, multi-use large event venue. Upgrades to the kitchen will allow the city to expand the number and types of events held at The Forum, bringing in tourist and recreation opportunities. The building also serves as an emergency shelter for all of Central Aroostook due to its location and capacity to serve 5,000 individuals.

### Kennebec County

Fall Award to: RSU 38 - Maranacook Area Schools

The CDL range expansion will train students faster and more efficiently, decreasing the current training cycle from four to three months. The added range size will also facilitate the eventual expansion into class A truck driver training.
